*Meaning

As I go about my day → Having nothing to do and feeling bored.

Daily life → All day long, from morning to night.

Trivial things that pass through my mind → Unimportant things that pop into my mind and
then disappear.

If I write something down randomly → Try writing something down randomly.

It's strange how lazy I am → It's strangely insane.
